8. Sanitary Pad Distribution Drive at Daultababd, 23rd February 2026

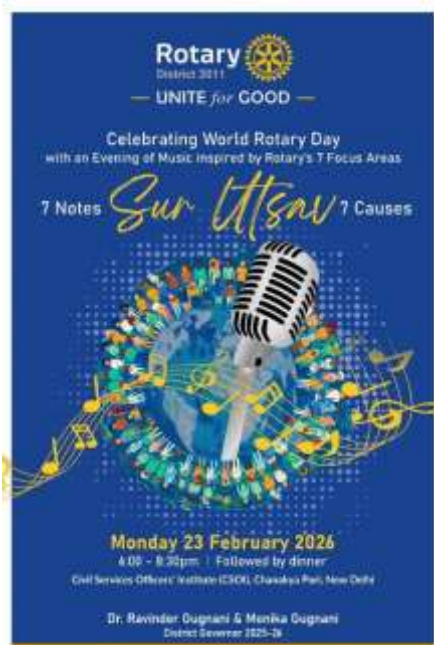
